**NEW- Master Row Crop Producer- New** 

Beginning with the 2020 application period, the Tennessee Agriculture Enhancement Program began offering an increased costshare amount for row crop producers who complete the Master Row Crop Producer Program. Although the application period has passed, information can be found on the TAEP website at:

https://www.tn.gov/agriculture/farms/taep.html Completion of the program will enable row crop producers to receive 50% of \$10,000 maximum reimbursement instead of the standard 35% reimbursement.

The program will largely be online.
Participants will be required to complete 12 hours of education covering a variety of subject matter. Programs such as the Middle Tennessee Grain Conference will count toward completion of the program. ## Tennessee Ag Enhancement Program Info-

Unfortunately, there is still confusion on the difference concerning University of Tennessee Master Beef Program and the Tennessee Department of Agriculture Tennessee Enhancement Program. The Tennessee Agricultural Enhancement Program (TAEP) established in 2005 provides costshare dollars to agricultural producers for making long-term

investments in Tennessee farms and communities. Participation allows producers to maximize farm profits, adapt to changing market situations, improve operation safety, increase farm efficiency, and make a positive economic impact. More than \$185 million has been invested in 62,942 producer projects from 2005 through 2019. Each TAEP dollar generates \$6.09 in local economies.

The annual application period in 2020 was October 1-7. **Programs include:** <u>Dairy Solutions</u>, <u>Herd Health</u>, <u>Genetics</u>, <u>Row Crop Solutions</u>, <u>Hay Storage</u>, <u>Livestock Equipment</u>, <u>Livestock Solutions</u>, <u>Working Facility Structures</u>, <u>Poultry Grower</u>, and Producer Diversification.

To participate in the Tennessee Agriculture Enhancement livestock programs, producers must have a current *Beef Quality Assurance* certification. Any producer that meets the minimum acreage and/or number of livestock and current BQA certification can apply and be eligible at 35% costshare. Producers can increase to 50% costshare reimbursement level by participating in a *Master Beef* program. And of course, you have to submit a TAEP application to be eligible for all costshare programs.

To apply for funds, beef producers must be BQA (beef quality assurance) certified. The University of Tennessee Extension administers the BQA program thru the Tennessee Cattlemen's Association with the

educational component. Costs of BQA certification is \$20 for Tennessee Cattlemen Association members and \$40 for nonmembers. All payments go directly to the Tennessee Cattlemen's Association.
